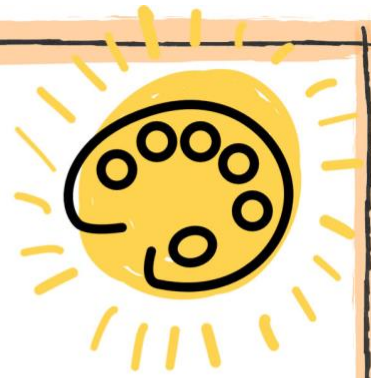


SUMMER TASKS:

TASK ONE



RESEARCH BRITISH GARDEN BIRDS.

Research British garden birds, use guide books and the internet to help you.

SUCCESS CRITERIA

Document your research by including facts- names, size, what they eat, where they live, the colour of their feathers.

TASK TWO



RSPB- ROYAL SOCIETY FOR THE PROTECTION OF BIRDS

Find out about the RSPB, Copy their logo, if possible visit one of their reserves.

SUCCESS CRITERIA

Document your findings- What does the organisation do? Where are they based? How are they funded? What is important about their work? If possible print off

TASK THREE



BIRD OBSERVATIONS

Take some photographs of birds (in your garden or the park) and make some quick sketches of them. Draw a more detailed version of your favourite bird. (Alternatively use the images found in task 1).

SUCCESS CRITERIA

To photography use a zoom function, use basic shapes to build up your sketches.

TASK FOUR



BIRD TRACKS AND FEET

Birds feet can be difficult to draw, it is important to observe them. As it can help you spot bird tracks and identify which birds may be in your locality. Produce some drawings of bird's feet/talons and find the bird tracks. Next time you are out and about see if you can spot any.

SUCCESS CRITERIA- Map out drawings using basic shapes and document facts and findings.

TASK FIVE



CARTOON BIRD

Create a cartoon character based on a British Garden bird. Why not create a comic book celebrating what you have learned from the summer tasks. Use your cartoon bird in the book.
