How To Complete This Worksheet

Each activity in this project is designed to improve your grade by 1%. There are 100 activities within this project which has been created to improve your grade in line with expectations when you return to school. In order to complete this project, you will need to work independently so follow the step by step guidelines below. If you are struggling to complete a square, move onto the next and come back to it. If you are still struggling, please email Mr Taylor on d.taylor@macademy.org.uk for support. Once all the boxes have been completed, submit it to your teacher (via email, post or hand it in when you are back in school) for marking and feedback.

1. Google examples or key words for each task and use these to create your own. If you are using software, use YouTube tutorial videos to help you use the apps and software if you need to. Ensure that each square takes at least 1 hour of hard work to complete.
2. If you can't access the links, email Mr Taylor for the longer link.
3. Use the command word index below to help you.
4. Collect all of your work together in one place, including recordings, in preparation to hand it in.

Command Word Index

- Timeline: A visual list, including text, dates and images to represent a period of time
- Create: To produce something
- Research: Identify the topic you will be researching, search google for information, evaluate your findings
- Guide: Write step by step information on how to complete a task, starting with the first step
- Analyse: Explain a thing or idea (such as how it works or how it creates its effect) by referring to the important parts that make it up. Supports its claims by referring to the findings of the analysis. Use this as a guide <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/guides/z9ktpv4/revision/1>
- Evaluate: Making judgements based on evidence. Look at the pros and cons of something and write your opinion to conclude
- Listen: Play the full piece of music, make notes as you are listening
- Features: Something specific that applies to a certain genre of music
- Flashcards: A card containing a small amount of information for revision purposes
- Poster: Using a medium of your choice, use images and a small amount of text to explain a topic to support revision
- Cheat Sheet: A page of in-depth information sectioned off into different topics
- Learn: To gain or acquire knowledge of or a skill by study or experience
- Write: Using standard English and paragraphs to explain a topic
- Compose: Complete a piece of music
- Describe: Write, in detail, paragraphs to explain all aspects of a problem, solution or an item.
